

MONIMAIL

1 Monimail Tower. Monimail KY15 7RJ 1000 - 1600 7/8th September



"Monimail Tower Project" is a small charity caring for a beautiful walled garden and orchard set around a mediaeval tower house in sunny Fife. The 13thC tower was a former residence of the Archbishops of St Andrews and comprises three storeys over a basement, which was later altered to form an icehouse. There is a small exhibition in the tower about its history and after visiting and enjoying the view from the roof you can take a walk around the walled orchard. garden and woods to see a range of ancient trees. These are self-guided activities, but charity members will be in the venue to assist and answer your questions.

NEWPORT ON TAY

2 Leng Memorial Chapel

Vicarsford Cemetery, Forgan. Newport on Tay DD6 8RB 1100 - 1600 8th September Sir John Leng was a 19th century entrepreneur from Hull who adopted Dundee and made



his name producing a pioneering daily newspaper for the people. He commissioned the Gothic style chapel as a memorial for his first wife, Mary. This charming A-Listed building was erected in 1895-7 to a design, by Dundee Architect Thomas Cappon, which reflected a miniature cathedral in 13th Century French style. It has a Caen stone interior and is adorned with gargovles, and carvings by John Bremner. Enjoy the magnificent views www.newportontayhistory.org.

3 Crail Museum

Sat 11am – 4pm Sunday 1.30pm – 4pm 7/8th, 14/15th, 21/22nd Sept.



Crail Museum & Heritage Centre gives insight into the past of this ancient Royal Burgh, its kirk, seafaring tradition, and the airfield HMS Jackdaw which was a Fleet Air Arm Station from the Great War to the 1960s, when it became a languages school for spies! Our exhibitions on special topics are changed regularly and our new exhibition this year is entitled "Volunteering in Crail". Today there is still commercial fishing from the picturesque harbour for crab and lobster, which have a reputation for quality. The museum has a children's play area.

Built in 1936 as a comfortable modern home in central Cupar, this private dwelling house has survived with limited modernisation. It is sympathetically decorated and fitted out with furniture, furnishings and appliances of the era; a living time-capsule of the sights, sounds and smells of a 1940s home. One-hour tours in small groups, conducted by the owners, with demonstration of "modern technology" for a

6 Dreel Halls

High Street West, Anstruther KY10 3DJ 1100-1700 Last entry 1630 8th September



Dreel Halls is a community and events venue in a historic complex of buildings comprising a 16thC tower, 18thC tolbooth, and 19thC church nave. Take a tour of the A Listed St Nicholas tower and. weather permitting, step onto the parapet for stunning views over Anstruther and the Isle of May. Explore the graveyard with its fascinating gravestones, and the stone coffin in which it's said St Ethernan floated across the sea. Learn of the planned works of Anstruther Improvements Association who own and operate the building for the community. Home baking available. Children are welcome on the tours of the tower but must be accompanied by a responsible adult.

Visit to see inside the 17thC lectern doocot, owned by the **Boarhills and Dunino Community** Trust and recently extensively restored from a ruinous condition. Guides will be there to talk about its history and how the project was conceived and carried out. There will be an exhibition in the Village Hall on the restoration project and there will also be displays exploring the history of Boarhills and Dunino Primary Schools. Teas and delicious cakes will be served in the Hall. and there will be a childrens' painting competition, 'Spot the Pigeon'.

9 Wilkie Memorial Hall

The Sir David Wilkie Memorial Hall is a Fife Council owned and run community building. This facility can be booked by the public and by community groups for various events and activities. TAYPORT

11 Auld Kirk

Castle Street, Tayport & Auld Kirk, Whitenhill, Tayport **DD6 9BY** 1000 - 1600 8th September A religious site since 1607, the Auld Kirk's present structure dates from 1794. It is one of the oldest buildings in Tayport and an important local landmark, in particular its distinctive leaning clock tower. The impressive John Miller organ was built and installed in 1899 in a newly created bay. The Auld Kirk is developing as an Arts and Heritage Centre, retaining the building's historic features.



The surrounding graveyard has many interesting slabs reflecting Tayport's history, maritime connections and the family grave of renowned local artist Cynicus (Martin Anderson). There will be a display of maps, photographs and films of old Tayport.

13 Bogward Doocot

44 Doocot Road, St Andrews KY16 8QP

The Bogward Doocot is a sixteenth century building of the 'beehive' type, so called because the circular shape resembled the bee-skeps or hives of the time. As recently as the 1960s it was part of the Bogward Farm and no modern houses then straddled the Lade Braes walk. About a mile out of central St Andrews, it can be reached on foot via the Lade Braes walk or by car via the Canongate or Hepburn Gardens, then turning into

Bogward and then Doocot Road. Join us on Sunday 8th September for an interesting peek inside the Doocot, a wander around the Lade Braes and to find out more about our preservation goals, events and membership.

14 Bell Pettigrew Museum at The University of St Andrews

Bute Buildings, School of Biology, Queen's Terrace, St Andrews KY16 9TS


Located in St Marv's Quad and named after James Bell Pettigrew, a pioneer in anatomy and early flying machines, the 'Bell Pettigrew' has been a teaching museum since its foundation in 1912 and houses a vast collection of natural history specimens and scientific instruments. Today the collection, with its many unique specimens, still continues to serve both students and the public. LEUCHARS

15 St Athernase

School Hill, Leuchars, KY16 0HD

Consecrated in the 1180s the chancel and apse of the church are some of the best 12thC Romanesque structures in Scotland. The nave and bell tower are later constructions, but recent works conserved much of the original arcaded Norman decoration, notably the human, animal, and grotesque corbels. The church's interior has many mason's marks and an early Albannach cross slab from the



9thC that is thought to be from the earlier chapel of St Bonac, which preceded the Norman church.

16 Star of the Sea

Our Lady Star of the Sea was designed by the renowned Scottish architect Reginald Fairlie and opened for worship in 1939. The building stands in extensive grounds, and its octagonal tower houses the



entrance to the building. Above the entrance is a sculpture of Stella Maris – Our Lady, Star of the Sea by Hew Lorimer. Fairlie trained as an architect with Sir Robert Stodart Lorimer, Hew Lorimer's father.

17 Cambo Gardens

The Stables Visitor Centre, Cambo Gardens, Kingsbarns, KY16 8QD

1100 - 1500 7/8th September

Explore the designed landscape of Cambo and discover some of the stories of the Erskine's who have made Cambo their home for over 300 years. The designed



landscape dates from the 18th and 19th centuries, and is attributed to Thomas Erskine, 9th Earl of Kellie (1745-1828). Who set about improving the estate by creating pleasure walks and gardens, and adding structures traditionally associated with a country house, such as the mausoleum, stables, walled garden, dovecote and lodges, and six iron bridges which span the burn.

20 St John the Evangelist Episcopal Church

Episcopal church built next

of Pittenweem. The church
was originally a plain oblong
orientated north-south. The
more ornate east-facing
chancel was added later, and
here you can admire the wood
carvings by Robert Lorimer,
who lived at nearby Kellie
Castle. All around you will find
splendid stained glass both old
and contemporary. Younger

Join us at the award -winning Byre Theatre building, for tours, talks, displays, and meet the Byre Team. The current building, the third Byre Theatre on the same site, was designed by awardwinning architects Nicoll Russell Studios of Broughty Ferry and was opened in 2001 by the late Sir Sean Connery. The Byre has been part of the University of St Andrews since 2014 and hosts around 800 events every year, with a programme which integrates professional performances with community and student work, while serving the community engagement, teaching and research interests of the University.

TAYPORT

22 St Margaret's

Queen Street, Tayport **DD6 9NS**

1300 - 1600 8th September

St Margaret's is a picturesque building of buttressed red brick, designed in late Victorian Gothic style by Dundee architect Thomas Martin Cappon in 1896. Its vaulted interior features extensive use of timber, and intricate window tracery. A late 19th century Estey reed organ is still in regular use. The font

was made by local craftsman Gilbert Atkinson, who also made two crosses from historic timber. There are several interesting memorials, including a Pascal Candle stand made by John (Jacky) Cooper and one to six altar boys who lost their lives in active service in the Second World War.



BURNTISLAND

23 Burntisland Parish Church

East Leven Street, Burntisland KY3 9DX

1400 - 1600 14/15th September



The church built in 1592 -95, was one of the first after the Reformation. It is square in design and unique in Scotland. In 1601 due to plague in Edinburgh King James VI held the general Assembly within its walls, and during that meeting granted an easier English translation of the Bible, which was printed in 1611 known as the 'King James Authorized Version'

EAST WEMYSS

24 Wemyss Caves

SWACS, Terras Hall, The Haugh, East Wemyss KY1 4SB

1330 - 1630 15th September

Come and see the largest collection of Pictish carvings anywhere - still in the place they were made over 1,500 years ago. Located on a




dramatic stretch of Fife coastline overlooking the Firth of Forth, the Wemyss Caves are home to over 50 inscribed symbols, animal figures and a depiction of an early medieval boat. The caves also house several crosses carved by the first Christian missionaries to visit the area and on the cliffs above sit the remains of medieval Macduff Castle, once home to the Earls of Fife.

BURNTISLAND 25 Erskine United Free Church

Kirkbank Road Burntisland KY3 9EW

1000 - 1200 14th September
Erskine church is an iconic
landmark in Burntisland, visible
to everyone who passes through
the town. Its outline can also be
seen on the RBS £10 note! The
congregation goes back to 1728
and moved to this building in
1903. A highlight is the stained
glass window "The Light of the
World". The church is usually
open once a week for worship so



this is a rare occasion to be able to come in and enjoy the beautiful architecture and surroundings. There will also be a display of documents, photographs, and a matchstick model of the church.

26 Kirkcaldy Sheriff Court Annexe

St Brycedale Avenue, Kirkcaldy KY1 1EU

The annexe at Kirkcaldy Sheriff and Justice of the Peace Court opened in July 2020, and consists of two new criminal



courtrooms and a custody suite located within the existing Kirkcaldy Police Station, providing improved accommodation for court users including victims, witnesses and jurors. Guided tours of the Court building take place throughout the day, these include the cell complex, where unsupervised children will be detained.

BURNTISLAND

27 Burntisland Heritage Trust

4 Kirkgate, Burntisland KY3 9DB

1100 - 1600 14/15th September

For 30 years Burntisland Heritage Group have organised summer exhibitions open to the general public. The exhibition in 2024 is titled "The Changing Face of Our Town" with the focus on the High Street, using "Then and Now " photographs. A separate room in the centre has a collection of 22 model boats. This part of the exhibition is on the ground floor. The Heritage collection also includes folders, DVDS, videos, and publications with a wealth of



information of interest to local people and visitors alike. The exhibition continues upstairs to the Burgh Chambers to see objects of importance when the town had it's own town council, as well as well regarded paintings by the largely self taught local photographer and artist Andrew Young, born in the Victorian era. The Burgh Chambers is, unfortunately, not wheel chair accessible.

NB The exhibition is wheelchair freindly but unfortunately the Burgh Chambers are only accessible by stairs

35 Law's Close

The Merchants House, 339-343 High Street, Kirkcaldy KY1 1JL

Law's Close is a 16thC merchant's house at the east end of Kirkcaldy High Street. Despite this long history, its core structure and garden remain largely intact and inside several rare examples of 16th and 17th century interior decoration



survive. The building was acquired by SHBT in 1986 and conscientiously restored over a 20-year period. Today it operates as a unique commercial premise and is home to a variety of small businesses. Construction was put on hold when the Second World War broke out, with work not resuming until 1950 and being completed by the end of the 50s. Because of its architectural features Town

House is a B Listed building. Alongside it there are six provost's lamps from the former Royal Burghs within the district. These are: Kirkcaldy, Burntisland, Kinghorn, Leven, Buckhaven and Methil. The lamps all formerly stood outside the houses of senior councillors but they were all brought to Townhouse when the royal burghs were abolished in 1975





The church fell into disrepair in the 18th century




